- 80% male, average age 42 years
- 80% born in UK
- 54% physical health problems, 81% mental health problems
- 32% harmful drinking (20+ units weekly women, 30+ units men)
- 40% drug misuse, 40% Class A drugs, 20% member drugs
- Length of time homeless longest in one year (9%), 15+ years (33%)
- 52% in hostel, 16% in shelter, 21% sleeping rough, 13% other temporary accommodation, 4% own tenancy
- 20% changed accommodation 4+ times during 12-month study period

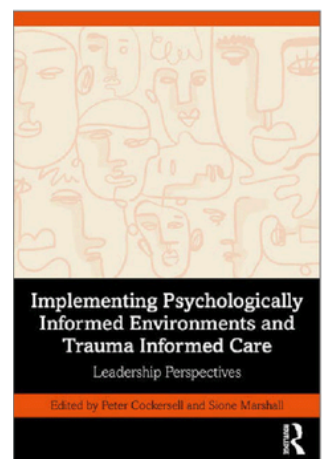
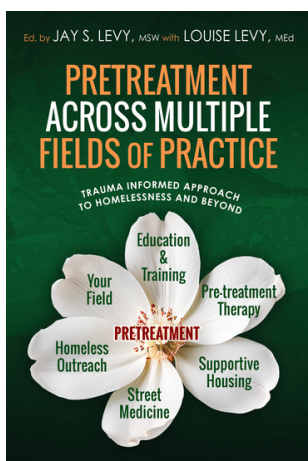
